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**RESTAURANT MANAGER, CHEF DE CUISINE NAMED TO DELIVER  
'SIMPLY PERFECT' DINING EXPERIENCE AT THE CREEK CLUB**

Named restaurant manager and chef de cuisine, respectively, the pair aims to deliver a “simply perfect” experience worthy of the million dollar Creek Club clubhouse, now under construction. “This is a wonderful opportunity; we’re all very excited about it,” Miller said. “It will be a perfect experience—one that begins as soon as members pull up to the front.”

Miller has 20 years’ experience perfecting the art of hospitality and service. Prior to joining Reynolds Plantation, Miller opened the Copperhead Lodge in North Georgia, after having worked at the Mid Pines Inn and Golf Resort. He also ran his own restaurant for three years in Southern Pines, N.C. “Having my own restaurant reinforced the idea that service has to be personal,” Miller said.

Brown agreed. Also a former restaurant owner with more than 20 years’ experience in the culinary field, Brown anticipated his return to the club environment when he took on the position of sous chef at The Plantation Grille at Reynolds Plantation in January 2007. “I wanted to get back into clubs, and wanted to get back into the south,” Brown says, adding he moved to the area from Fort Wayne, Ind. “I love the climate here and the people here.”

Brown said he anticipates the personal interaction that will result from serving members at the private Creek Club. “I really enjoy learning the needs of the membership to personalize their experience,” Brown added.

That notion will extend to the menu, currently being developed. “The direction that we’re going with the menu is simple, yet perfect,” Brown said. “That means members will experience traditional grill items like steaks and seafood, along with salad, sandwiches and daily specials—all at a great value.”

Brown is a graduate of Ivy Tech College in Indiana, where he received his associate’s degree in Culinary Arts. He lives in Eatonton, Ga. with fiancée Kristine and son Derek, 16.

Miller attended Georgia State University, studying hotel and restaurant management. He currently lives in Dunwoody, Ga., with wife Elizabeth and sons Robert, 14 and Henry, 12.
