**ROMAN TERLECKYJ TO OVERSEE NEW DIRECTION FOR THE ARTS AT
REYNOLDS PLANTATION**

Greensboro, Ga. (November 29, 2006) – Though the cultural landscape at Reynolds Plantation continues to evolve with varied arts and entertainment programs unfolding throughout the Linger Longer Communities, a new direction in the fine arts has begun to emerge under the experienced eye of Roman Terleckyj.

The veteran arts planner of more than 25 years has traveled from Washington, D.C. to Greensboro to take his place as the newly-appointed General Director of Arts and Culture at Reynolds Plantation. His arrival here marks the latest leg of what has been a decades-long journey throughout the arts world. “Most kids dream of running away and joining the circus,” Terleckyj said. “I dreamed of running away and joining an opera company. This rather curious twist led to marvelous adventures, a challenging career and now to Reynolds Plantation.”

Before reaching the tranquil seclusion of Lake Oconee, however, Terleckyj traversed the oceans to produce, direct and coordinate productions in countries like Italy, Germany, England, Ireland, China and Australia, with a focus on opera, festivals and international arts presentations. During that time, Terleckyj became a stage director for the international opera, solidified a 19-year working association with composer Gian Carlo Menotti and honed his considerable skills in arts administration, among other notable achievements.

During his 30-year association with The John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington, D.C.—where he most recently served as Vice President of Artistic Planning—Terleckyj coordinated the development of more than 3,000 performances, presentations and exhibits each season. He also programmed a series of performances with the White House entitled “Millennium Masters”, and, among other associations, has worked with the Washington Opera, The Wolf Trap Foundation and international arts festivals like the Spoleto Festival.

While Greensboro may be a journey from the international stage, Terleckyj looks forward to this new chapter in his life and feels his experiences will converge to unearth a new cultural vision for Linger Longer Communities. “Gaby and Mercer shared their dream about the future of this special community and the role that they see for the arts as the region continues to grow,” Terleckyj explained. “With one more adventure left in me, I knew I wanted to be part of that vision.”
